


How to Remotely Sign In To a Committee Hearing With Your Stance on a Bill

The Washington State Legislature allows for you to sign in to a committee hearing with your stance on a particular bill item. Follow the instructions below to do so:

1. Visit the Washington State Legislature Remote Committee Sign On page. In a web browser, type in <https://app.leg.wa.gov/CSlremote>



2. Select the chamber it's being considered in (either the Senate or the House). For this example, I will select Senate.



3. Select the Committee name, then the meeting time from the drop down menu. You'll need the name of the committee it's being heard in, the date, and the time of the hearing.



4. Once you've done so, you'll see a list of agenda items and bills being considered. Select the Bill number and title you wish to sign in on.



5. Select "I would like my position noted for the legislative record." You don't need to attend the hearing to note your position.

6. You will be taken to a page where you can note your position ("PRO" "CON" or "Other") and enter your information.

IMPORTANT NOTE: ANY information entered in the form, including contact information (names, addresses, etc.) is publicly disclosable upon request. If you DO NOT want your address publicly disclosable, submit "decline" in the address line or use another address in your district instead. Entering your city is helpful so that legislators know what district you are contacting them from but DO NOT DO SO if it does not feel safe.
