When will I receive my ballot?

Ballots are mailed to registered voters 20 days before the election. If you do not receive your ballot, call King County Elections at (206) 296-8683.

How do I turn in my ballot?

- **Use a Ballot Drop Box.** Turn your ballot in by 8 p.m. on election day to a drop box near you.

- **Mail your ballot.** No stamp required. Simply put your ballot in any mailbox. It must be postmarked by 5 p.m. on Election Day.

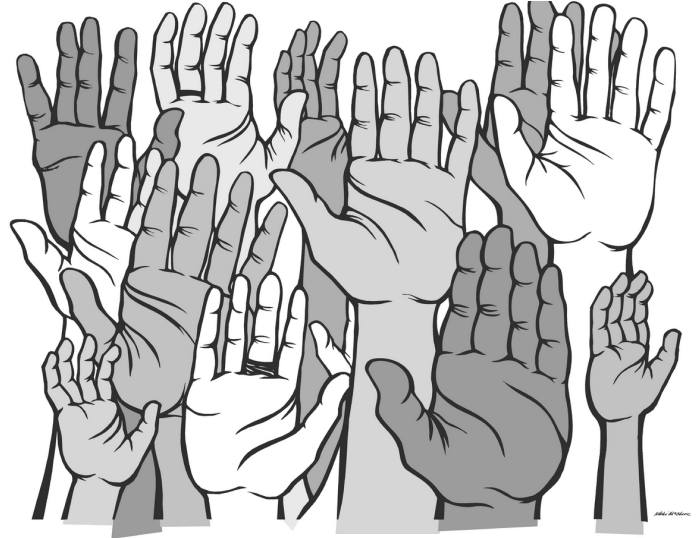

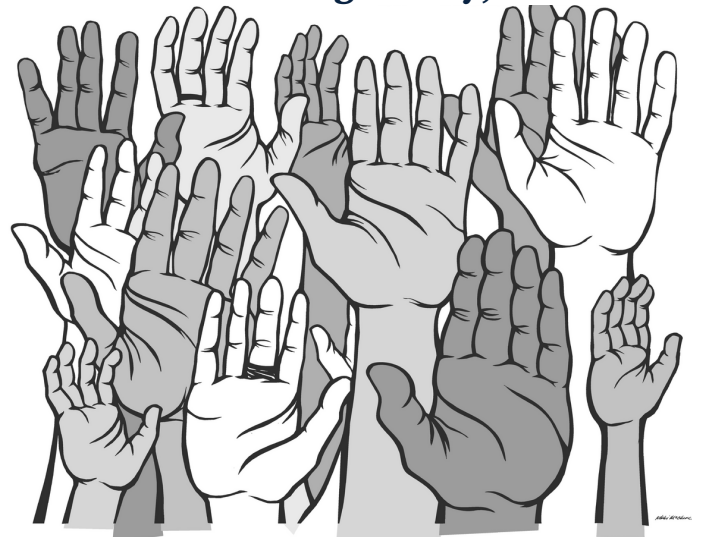
