 keep members up-to-speed about substantive issues and empower people to communicate directly with people who
 represent them.

- Homeless Voter Registration and Voting Rights Education: We register people experiencing homelessness to vote and train volunteers and staff at member organizations to encourage participation in the democratic process. Central to these non-partisan skills is empowering marginalized groups to know their voting rights
